Moreover, American energy statecraft has reshuffled the geopolitical landscape and sowed the seeds of peace in the Middle East, enabling old adversaries to become allies. In 2020, the United States brokered the Abraham Accords—promoting unprecedented normalization and multilateral ties between its closest ally, Israel, and Arab States including the United Arab Emirates, the Kingdom of Bahrain, Sudan, and the Kingdom of Morocco.

CSA champions the ideals of the Abraham Accords and their critical impact on geopolitical security and global trade. CSA is advancing these partnerships and is committed to bringing multi-faceted awareness to complex and evolving challenges.



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Survey Methodology

- **Data was collected from June 7-10 2026**, August 28-30, 2025, February 2-4, 2025 and July 8 - 10, 2024. Panels LTD, which has conducted over 10,000 surveys in Israel since its inception in 2006, collected the data. **The margin of sampling error is +/- 4.0%** with a confidence level of 95%.
- June 2026: The majority of the **557 respondents** (89%) were surveyed in Hebrew via the Panels LTD online panel which includes over 30,000 active Israeli members. This sample was supplemented with 11% telephone/cellphone surveys, 6% in Hebrew to ultra-orthodox communities and 5% in Russian to Russian speaking Israelis.
- August 2025: The majority of the **613 respondents** (97%) were surveyed in Hebrew via the Panels LTD online panel which includes over 30,000 active Israeli members. This sample was supplemented with 8% telephone/cellphone surveys, 4% in Hebrew to ultra-orthodox communities and 4% in Russian to Russian speaking Israelis.
- February 2025: The majority of the **529 respondents** (91%) were surveyed in Hebrew via the Panels LTD online panel which includes over 30,000 active Israeli members. This sample was supplemented with 8% telephone/cellphone surveys, 4% in Hebrew to ultra-orthodox communities and 4% in Russian to Russian speaking Israelis.
- July 2024: The majority of the **612 respondents** (91%) were surveyed in Hebrew via the Panels LTD online panel which includes over 30,000 active Israeli members. This sample was supplemented with 9% telephone/cellphone surveys, 7% in Hebrew to ultra-orthodox communities and 3% in Russian to Russian speaking Israelis.
- Socio-demographic quotas of age, gender, geography, heritage and religiosity were based on the most up-to-date data from the Israeli Bureau of Statistics. A slight weight was applied to the location and self-identified heritage of the survey.
- **All numbers of .5 and higher are rounded up** in this presentation.
- Respondents were filtered to likely voters by self identifying as having voted in the 2022 parliamentary elections in Israel (91% of respondents) or as having not been old enough to vote in 2022 but eligible to vote now (4% of respondents)
- While the language “likely Israeli voters” is used, it must be clear that **this data reveals the opinions of Jewish voters only in Israel and not the opinions of Israeli Arabs** who make up ~21% of the population

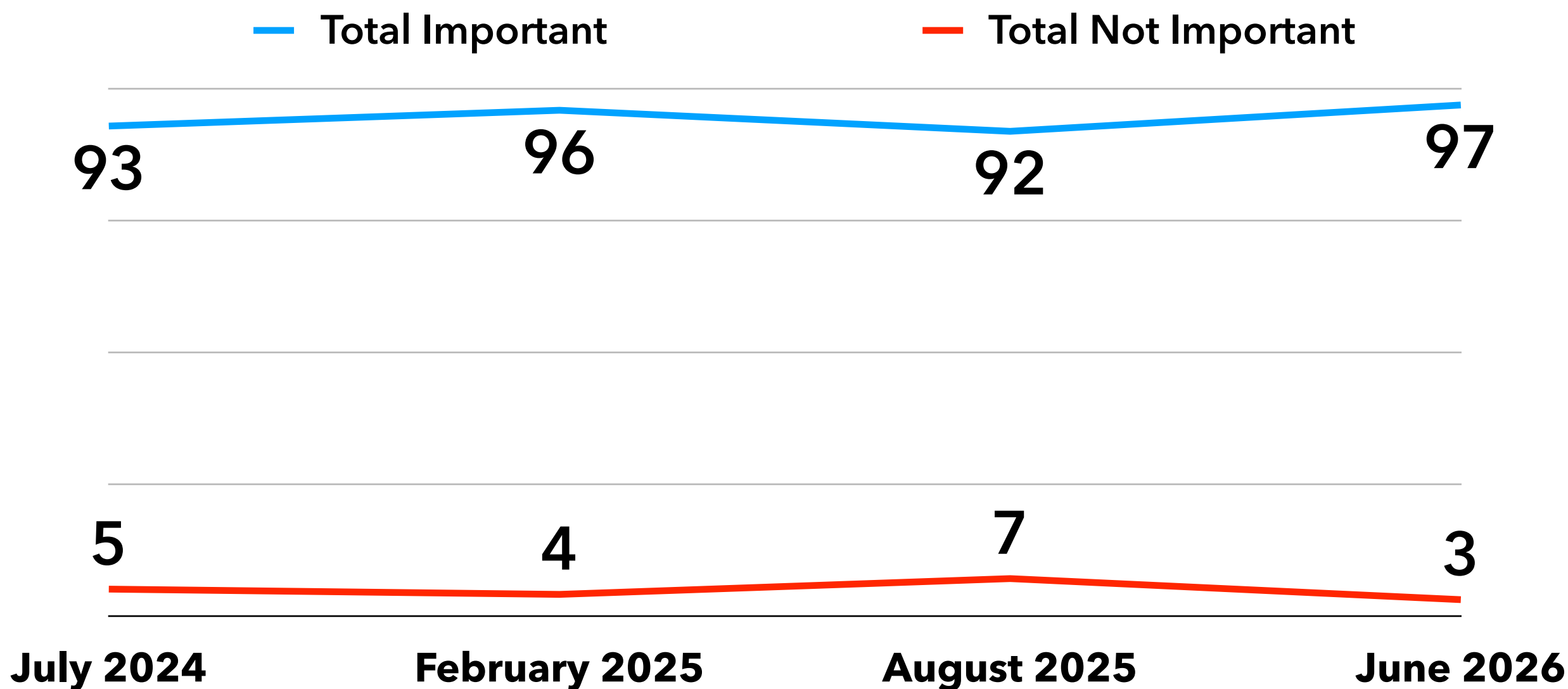


US-Israel Relationship



Near unanimous agreement amongst Israeli voters of the importance of the Israel-US relationship

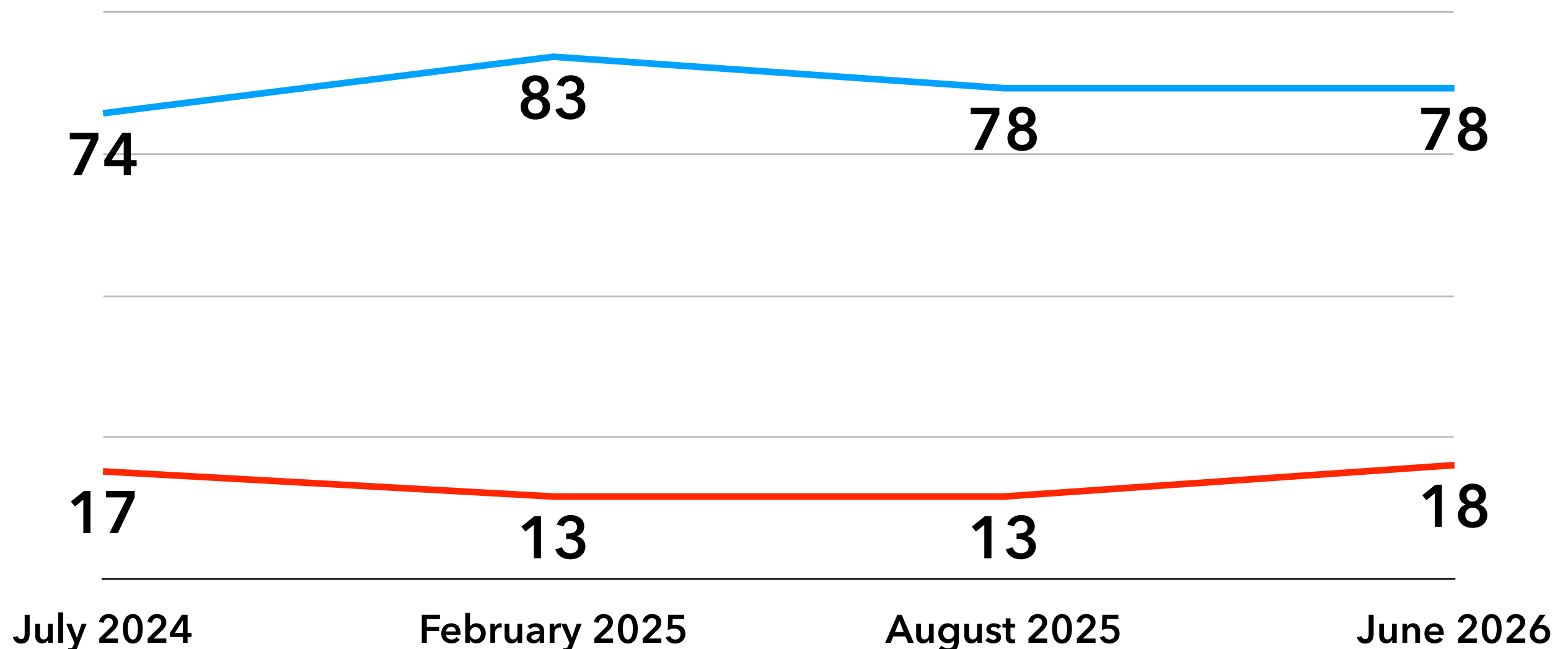

- The support of the US for the State of Israel is not critical for Israel's future

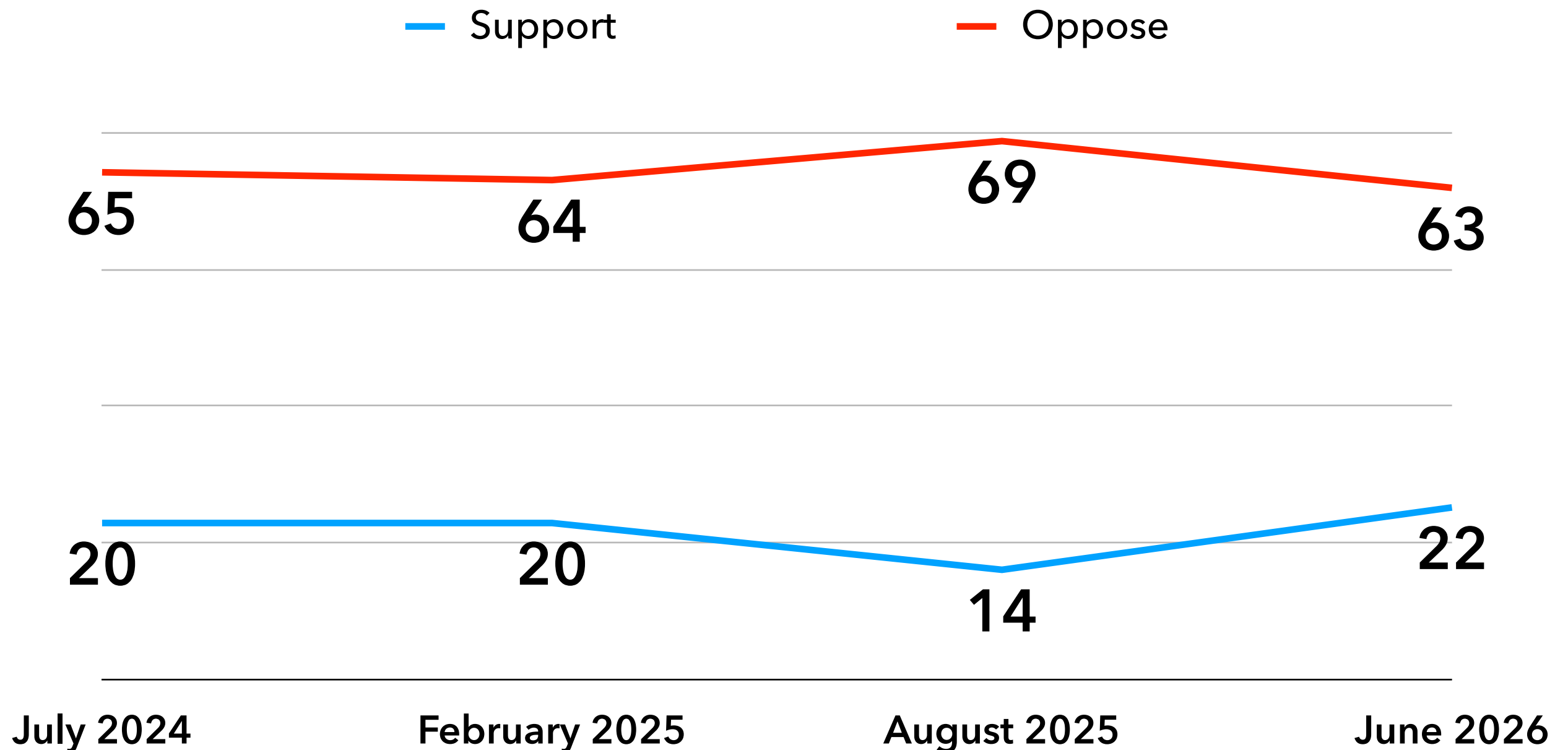


Two State Solution

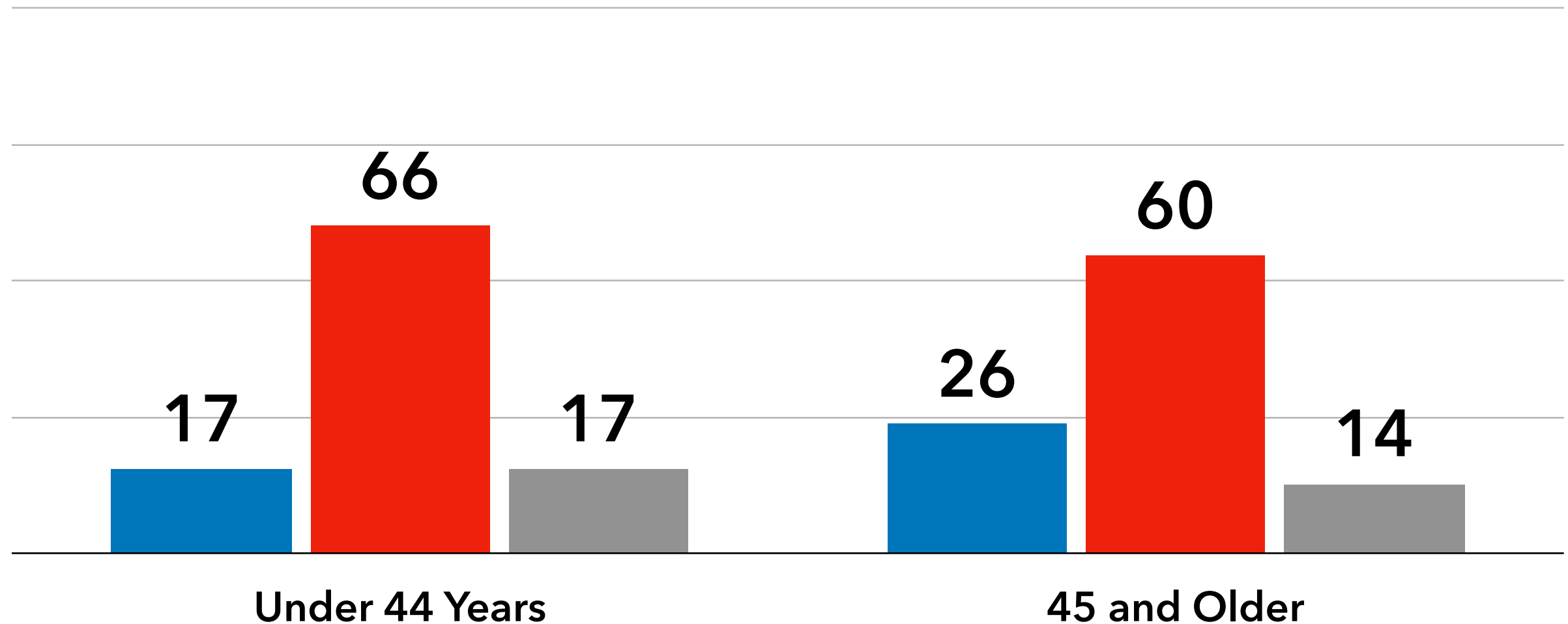


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Support for 2 State Solution - Generational Divide

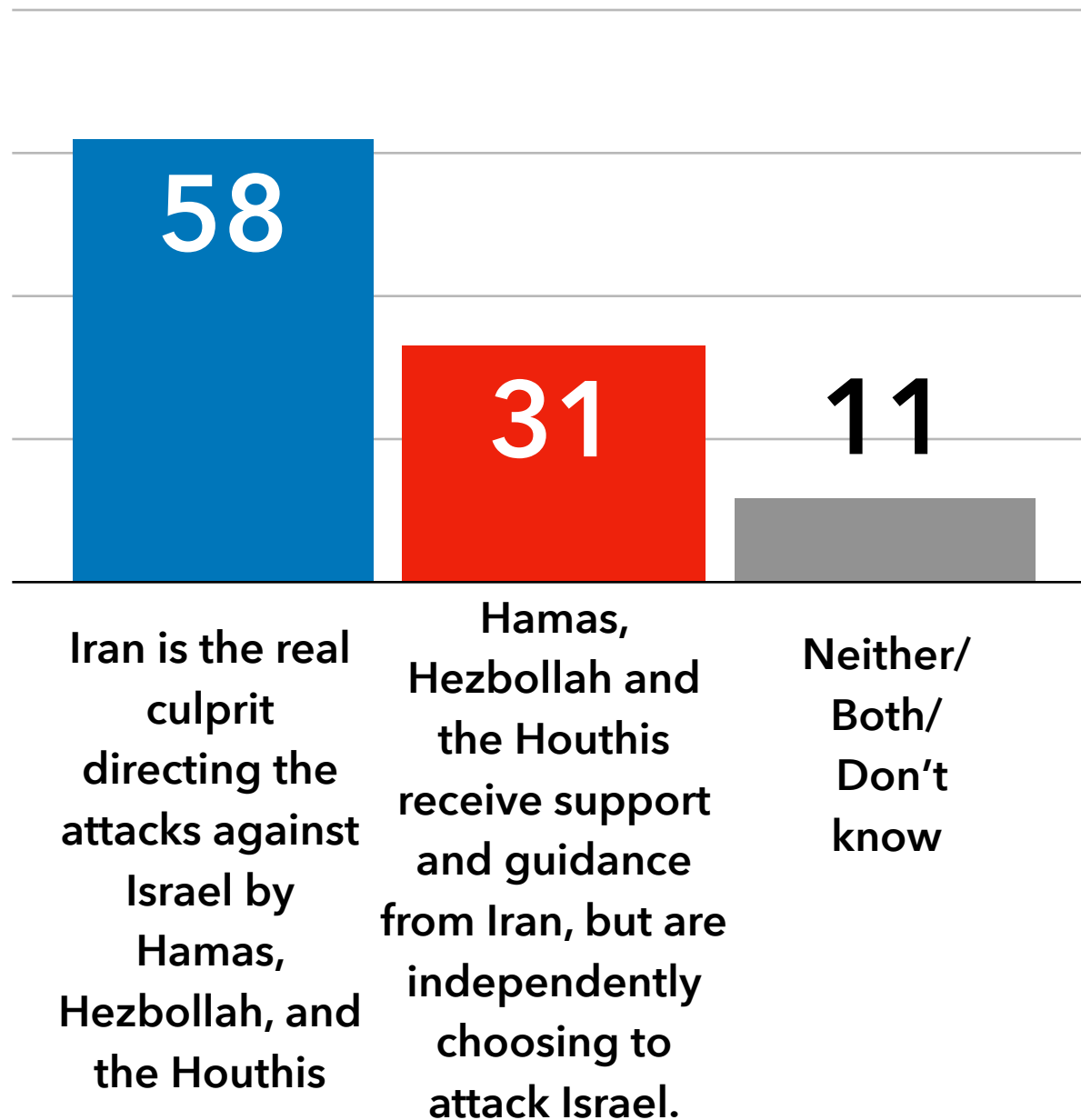

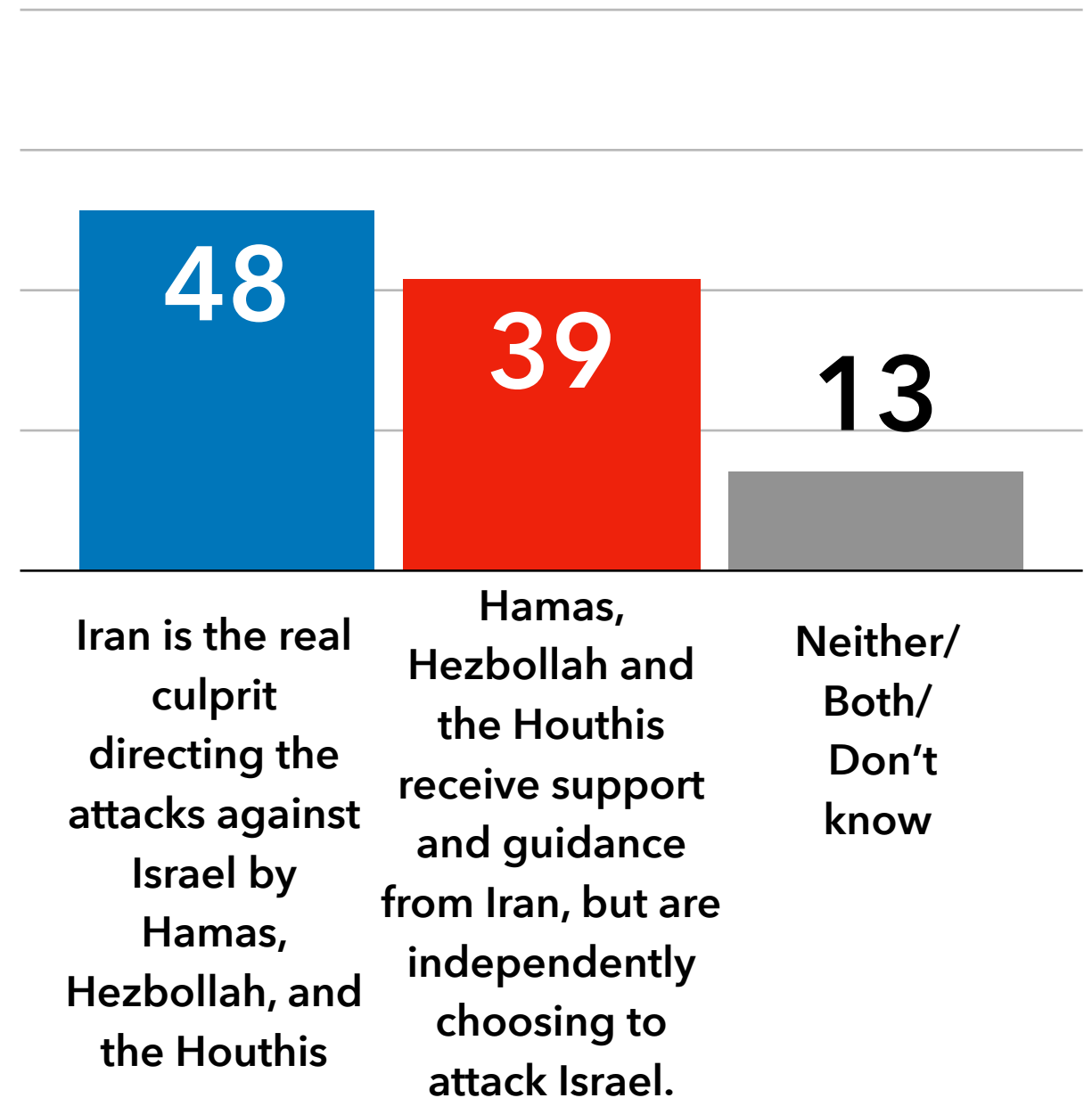

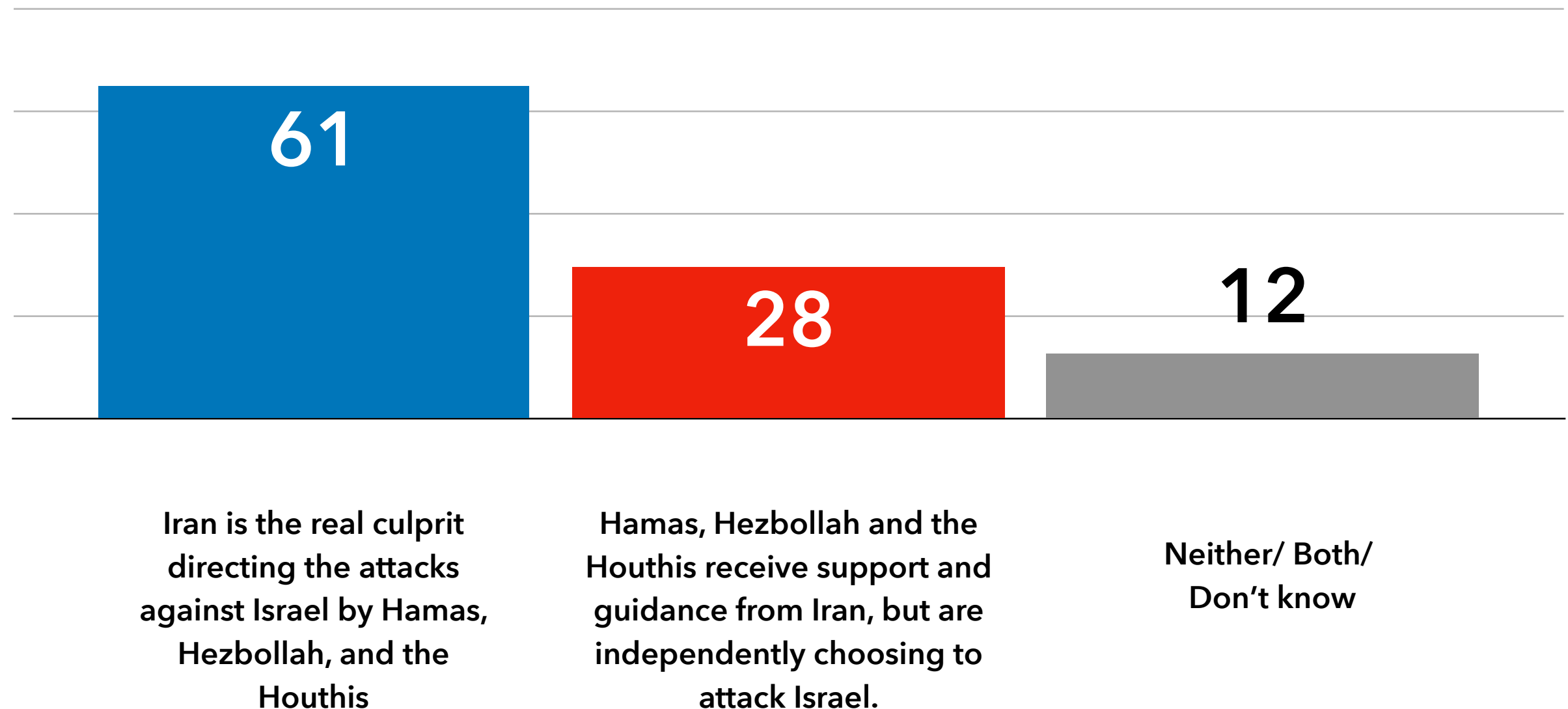

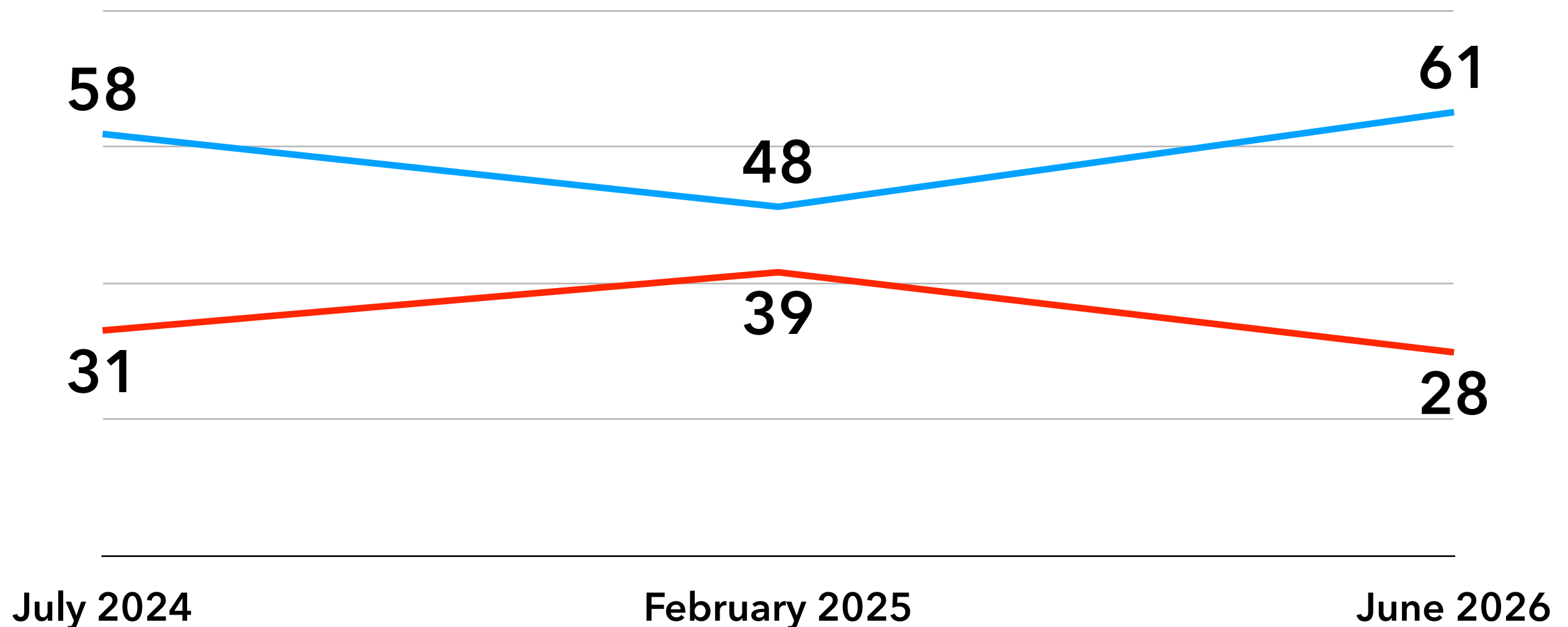

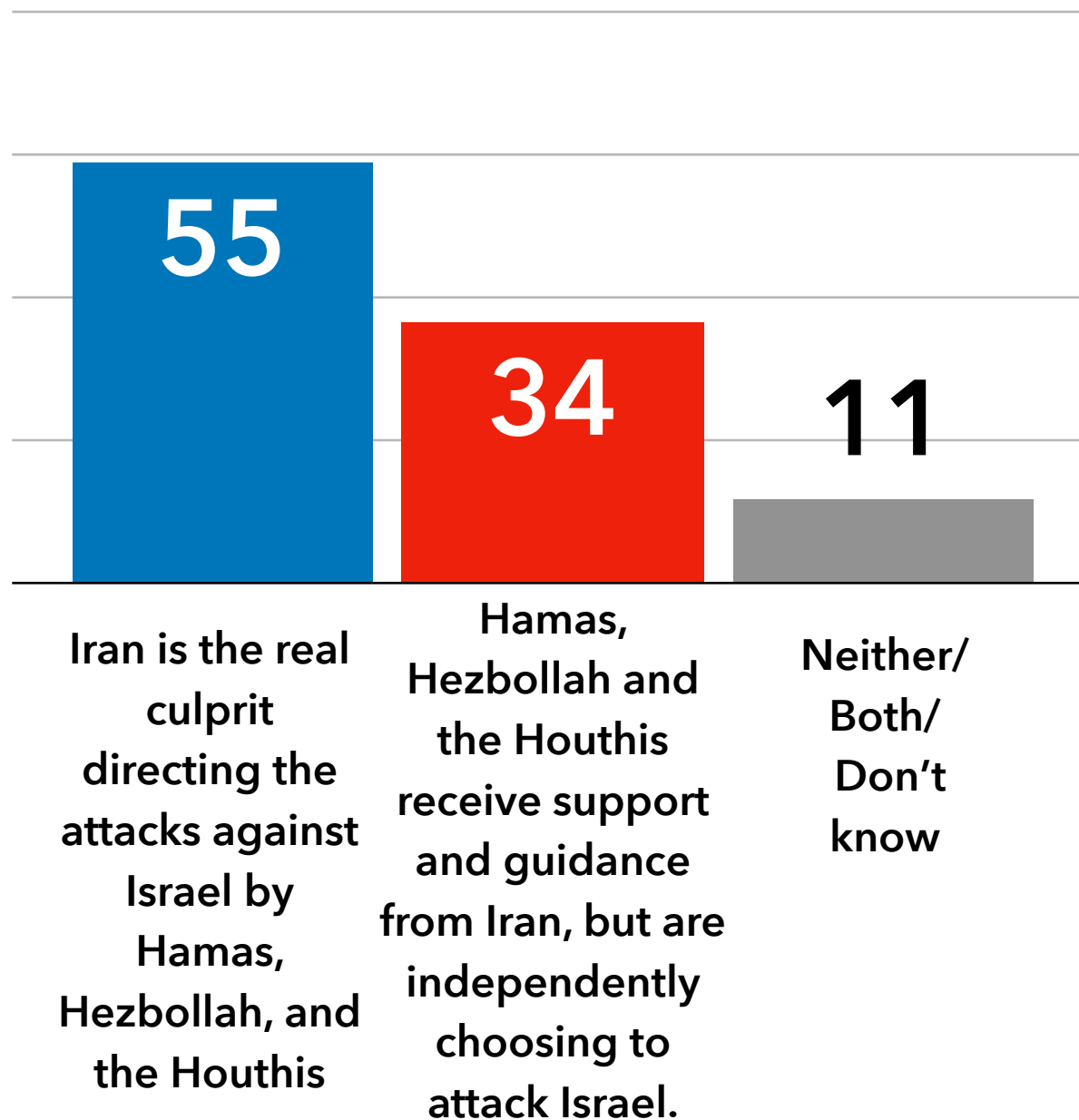

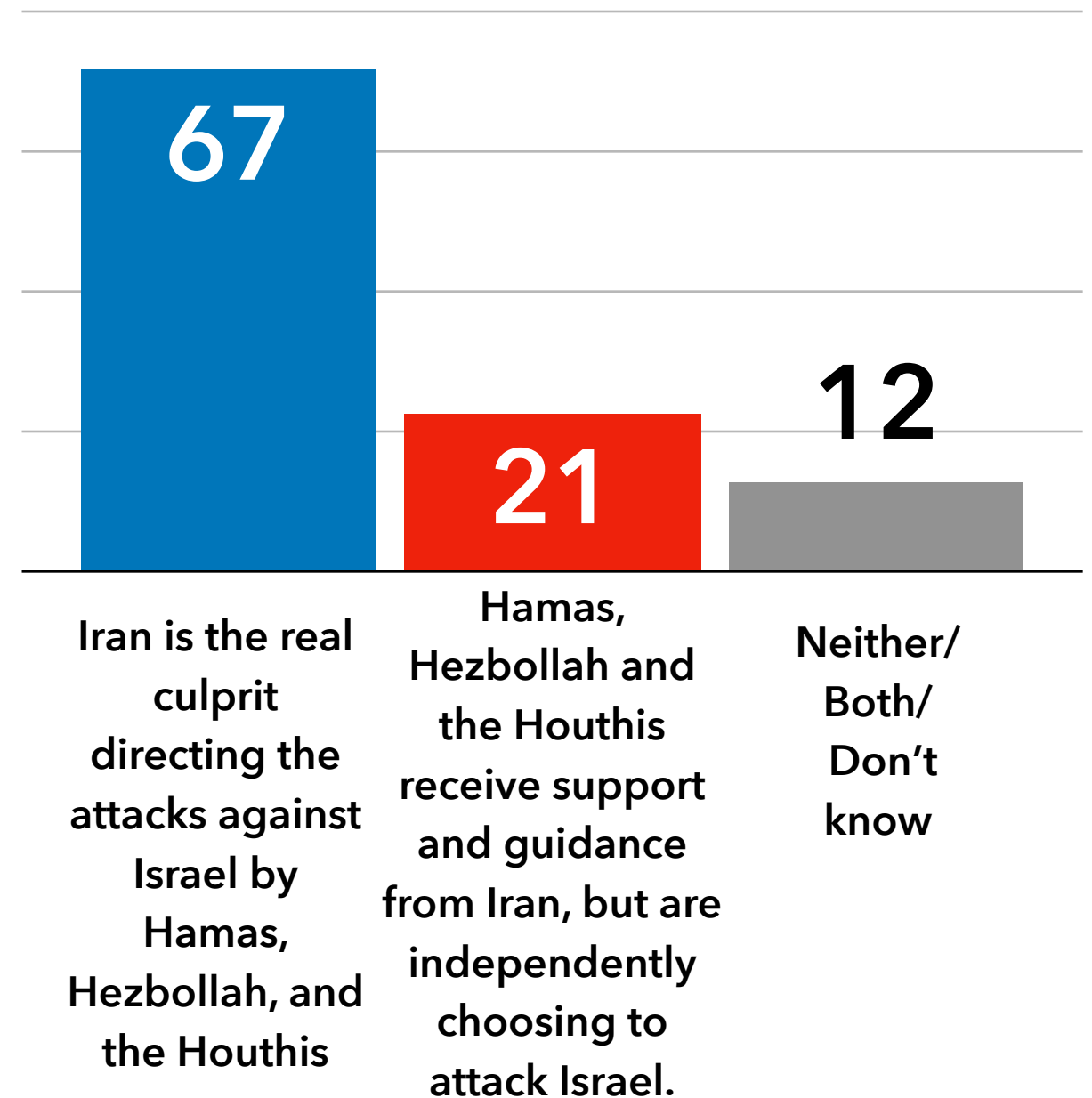
Older Israelis see Iran as the real culprit directing attacks from Hamas, Hezbollah and the Houthis

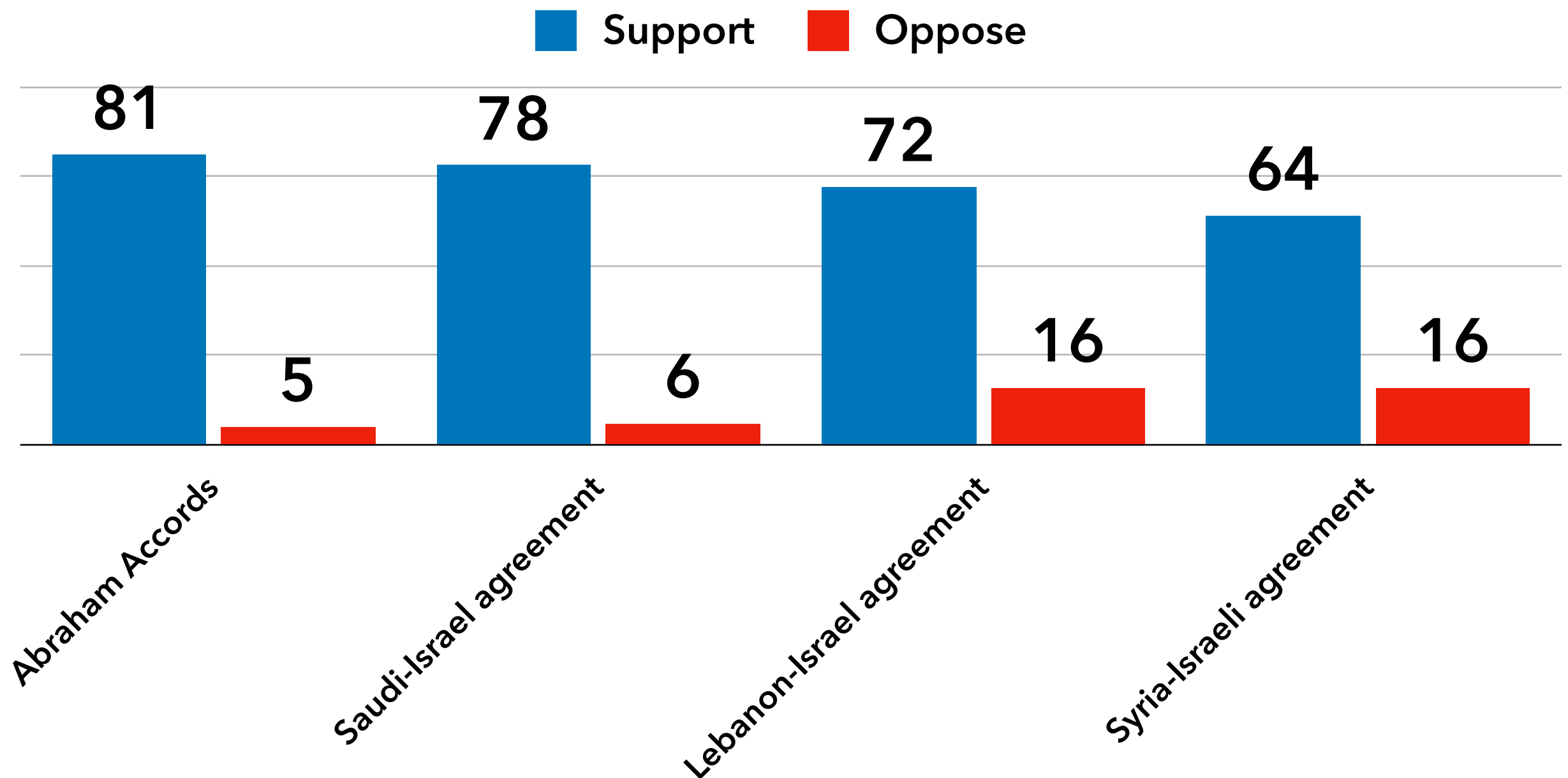

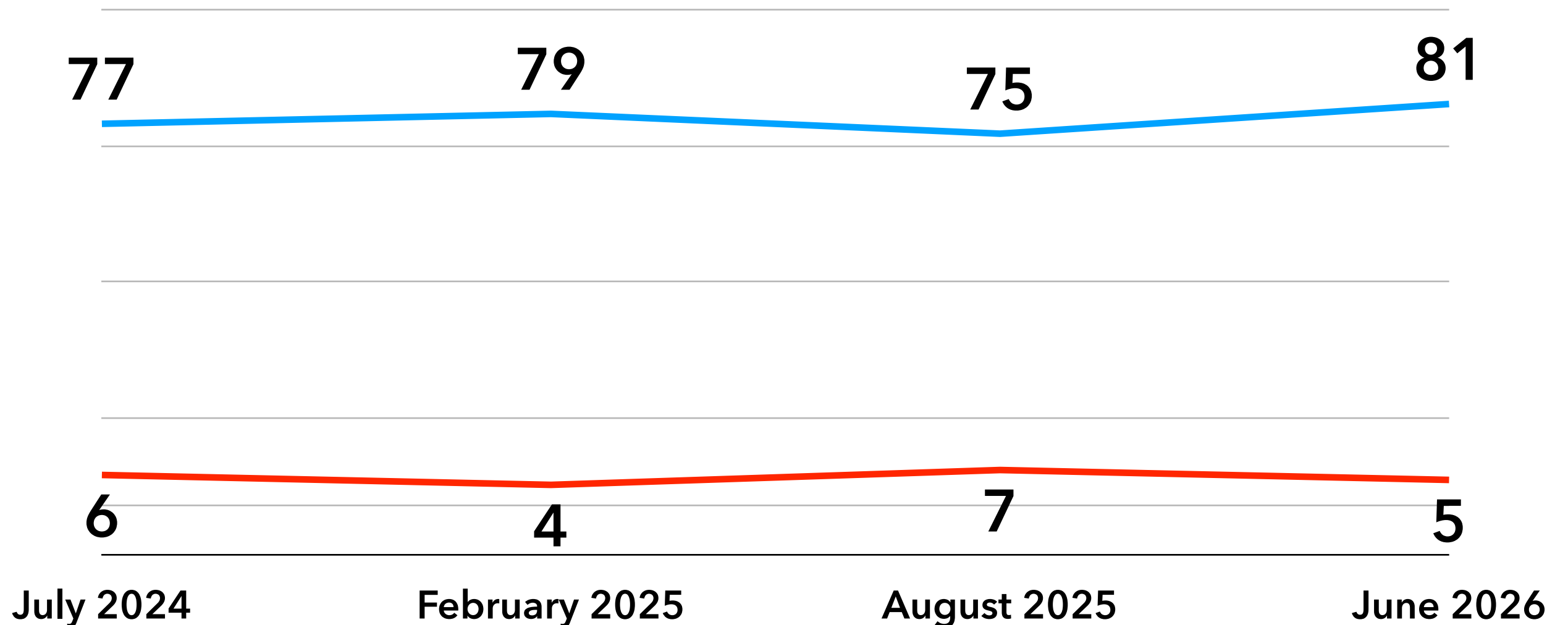


Abraham Accords remain very popular in Israel

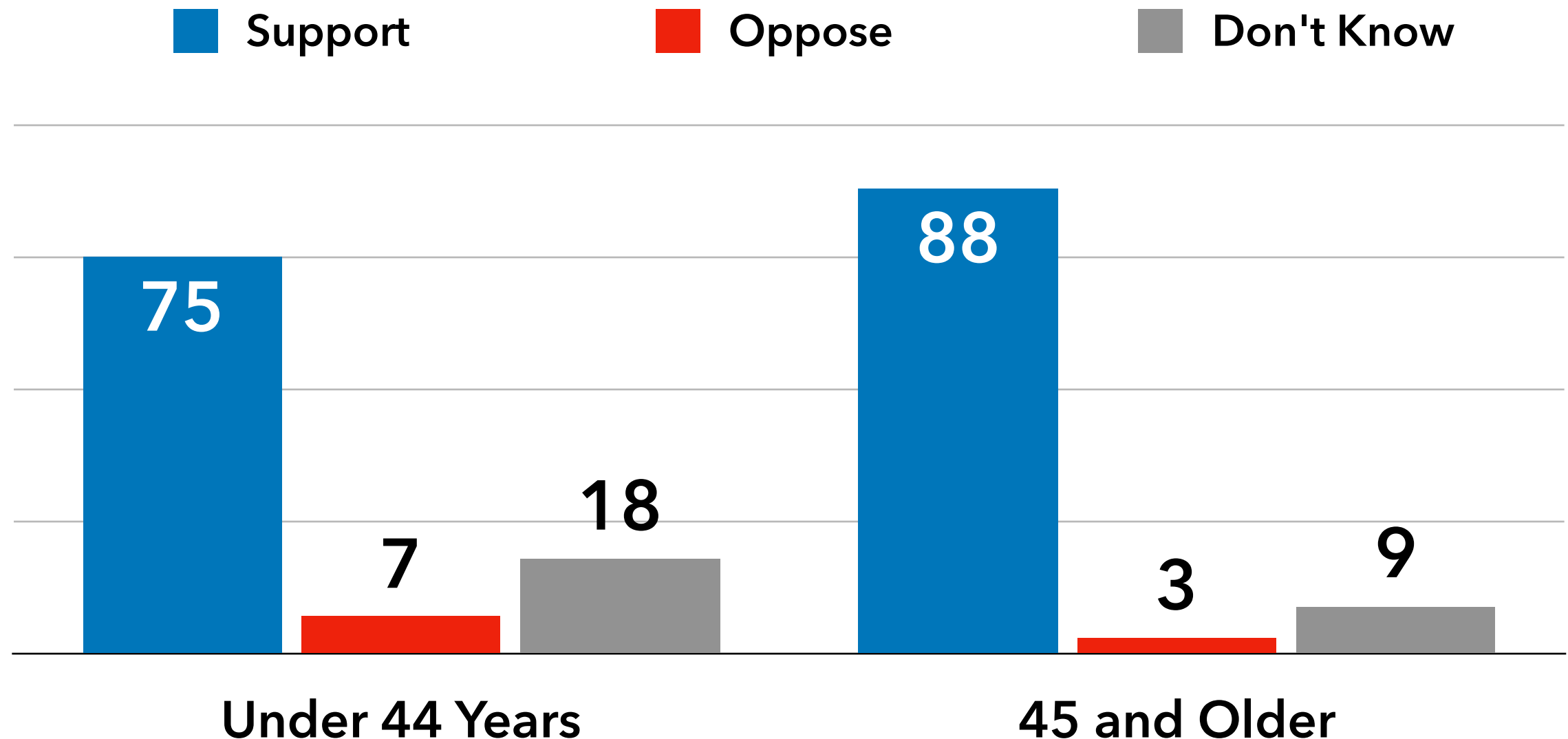

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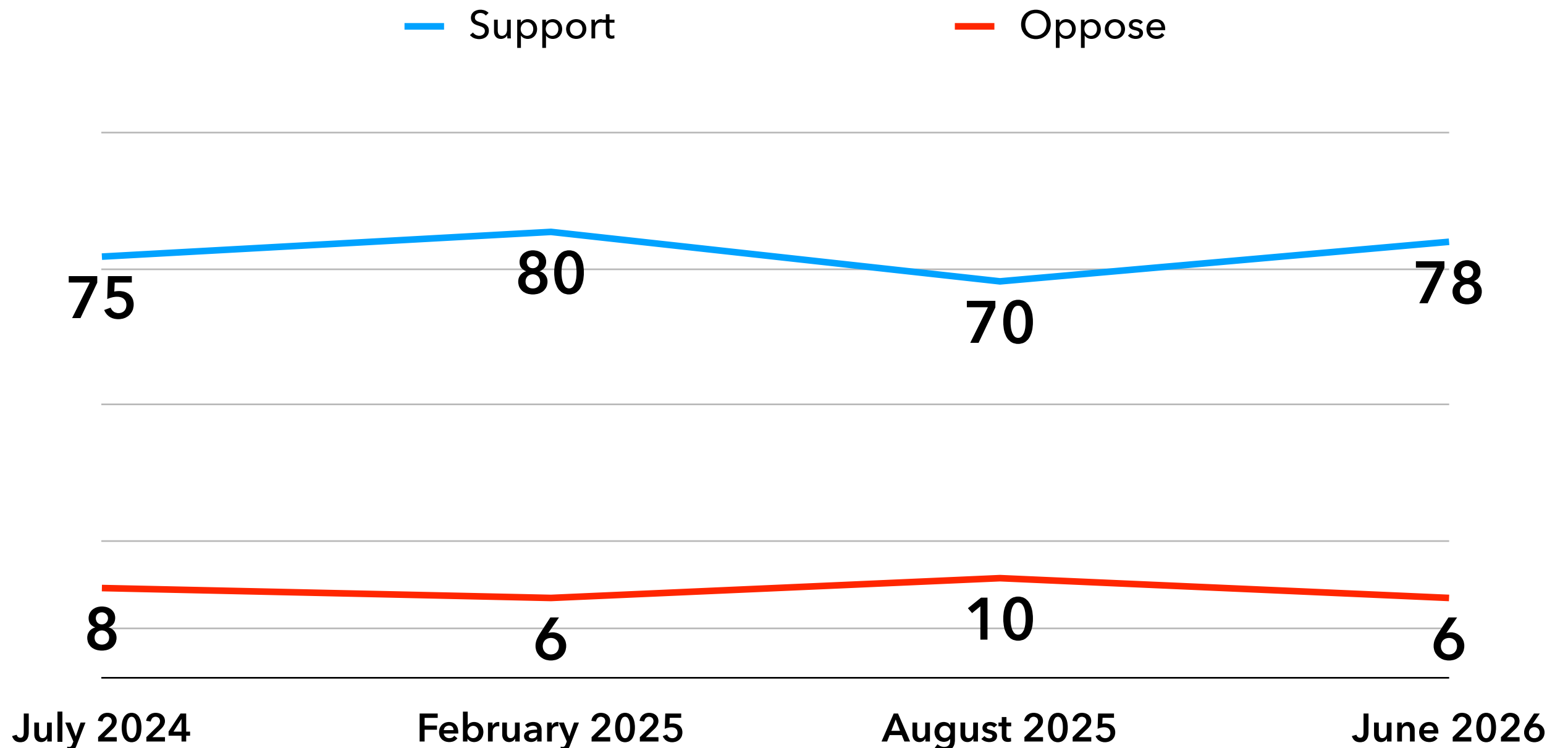
Majority of all age groups support the Abraham Accords, with older Israelis giving strongest support

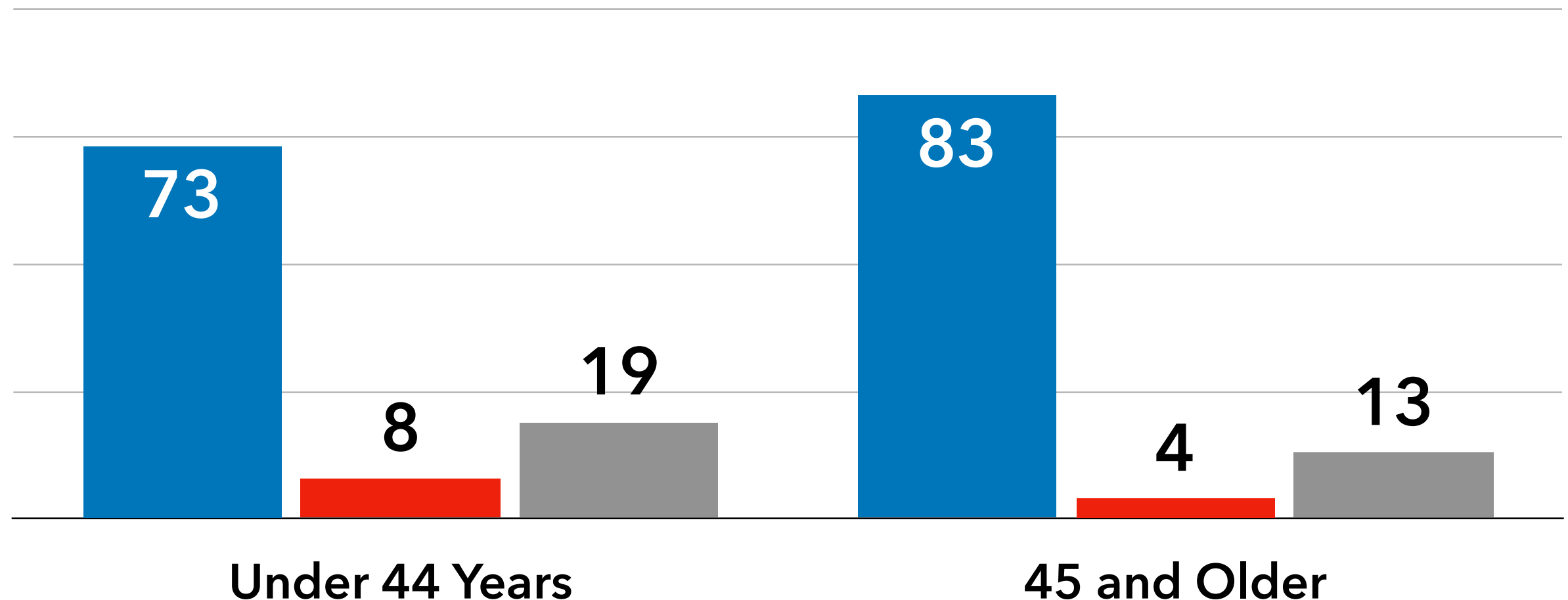


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Majority of all age groups support an Israel-Saudi agreement, with support strongest amongst older Israelis

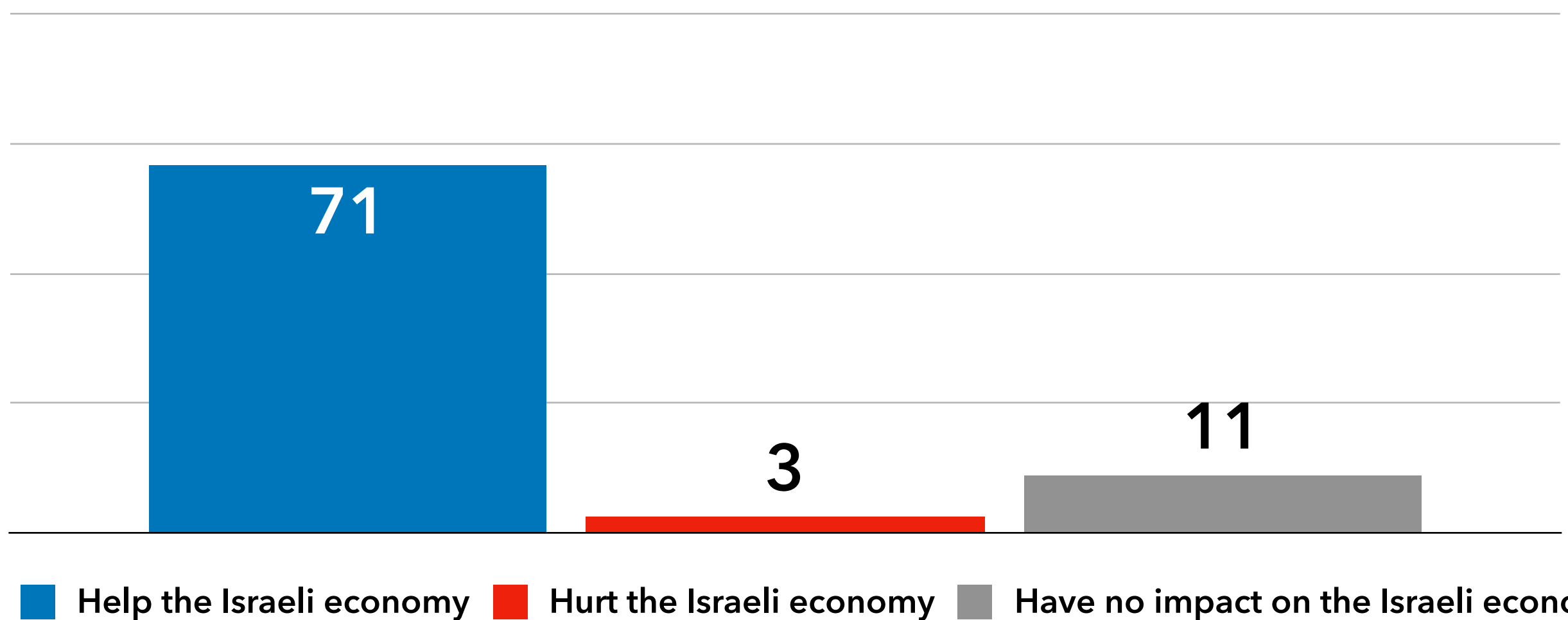
Do you support or oppose a future diplomatic agreement between Israel and Saudi Arabia? (by age)

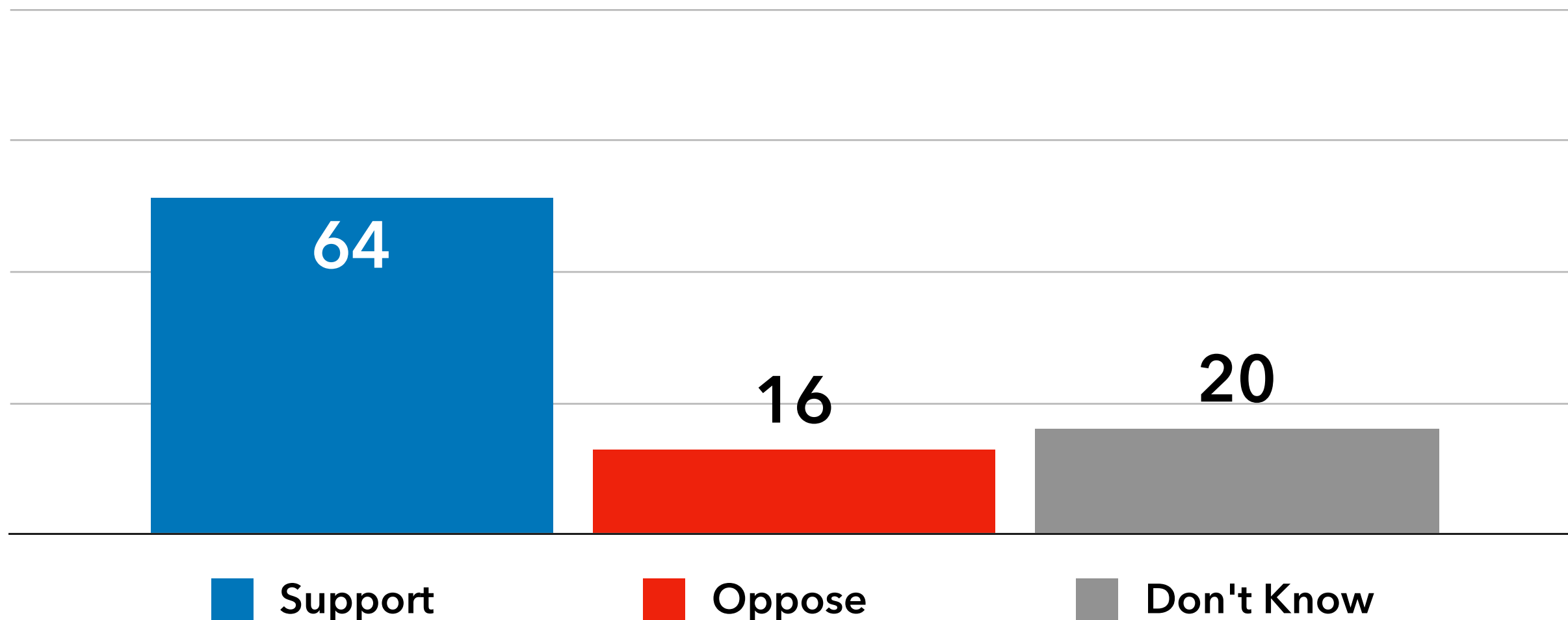
Saudi-Israel relations would help Israeli economy

And if there was diplomatic relations between Israel and Saudi Arabia, do you think it would help, hurt, or not impact the Israeli economy?



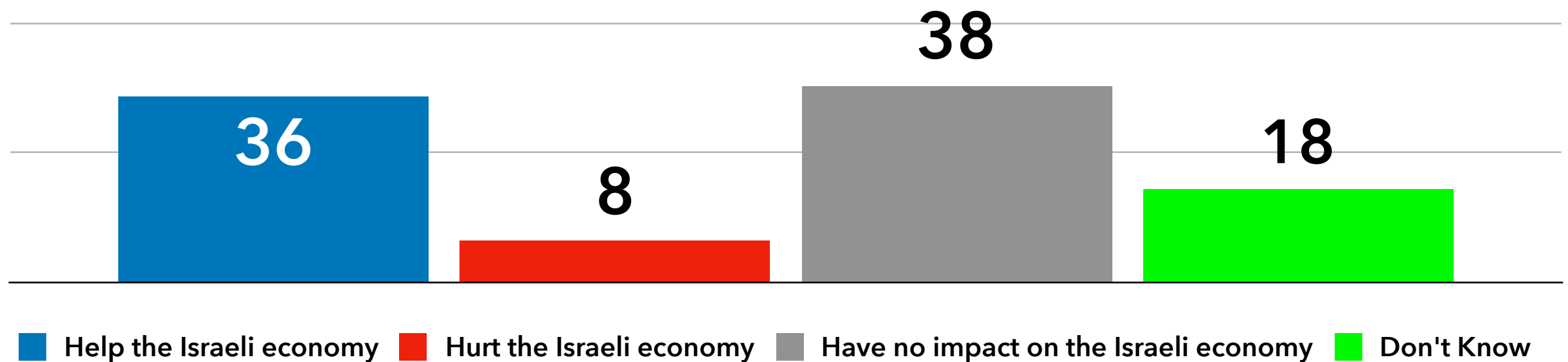
Majority of Israelis support agreement with Syria

Do you support or oppose a future diplomatic agreement between Israel and Syria?



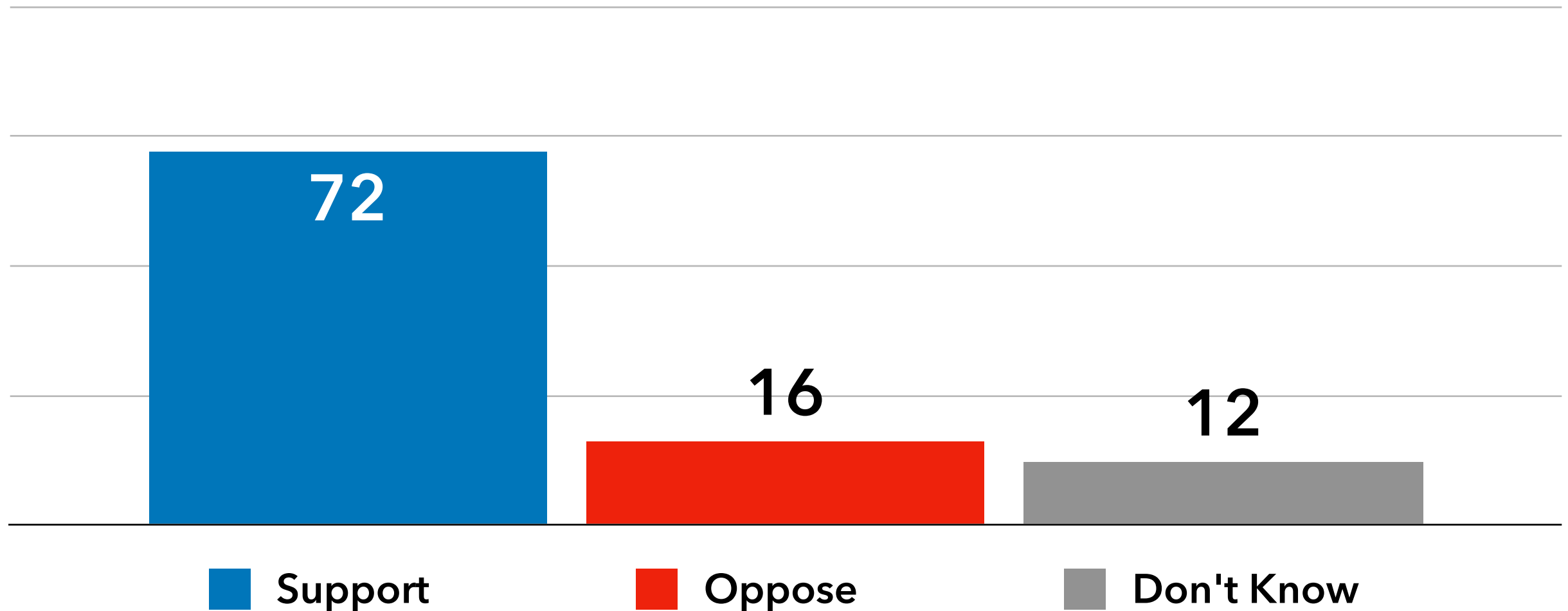
Mixed views on economic impact of Syria-Israel agreement

And if there was diplomatic relations between Israel and Syria, do you think it would help, hurt, or not impact the Israeli economy?



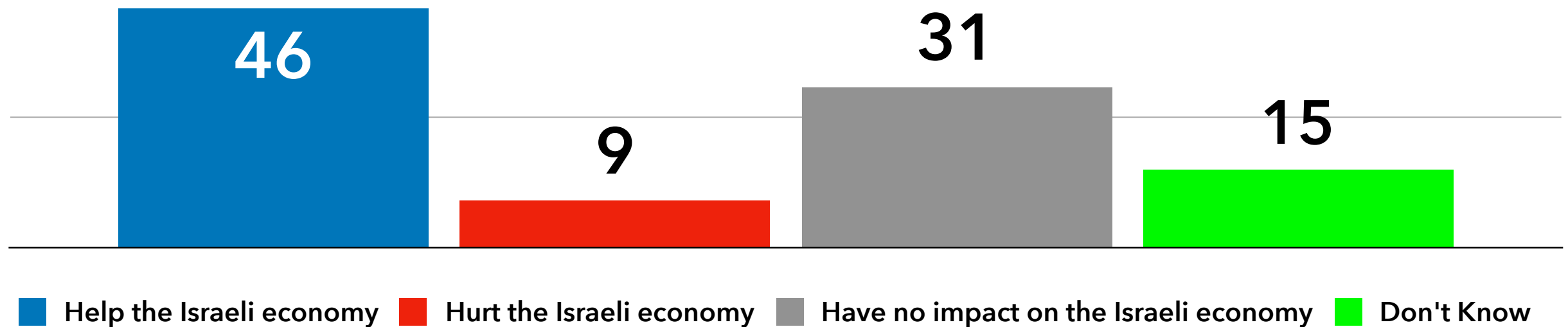
Majority of Israelis support agreement with Lebanon

Do you support or oppose a future diplomatic agreement between Israel and Lebanon?



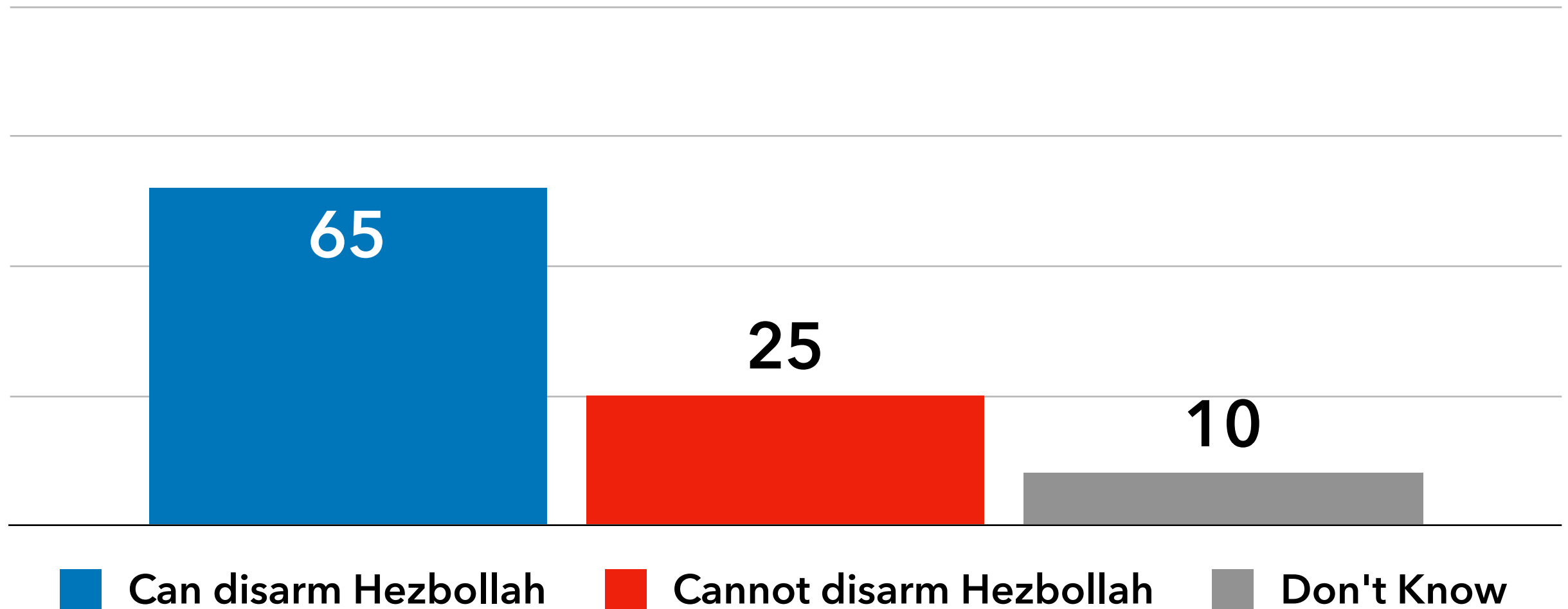
Mixed views on economic impact of Lebanon-Israel agreement

Do you believe that the US, IDF, and Lebanese Armed Forces together can or cannot one day disarm Hezbollah?

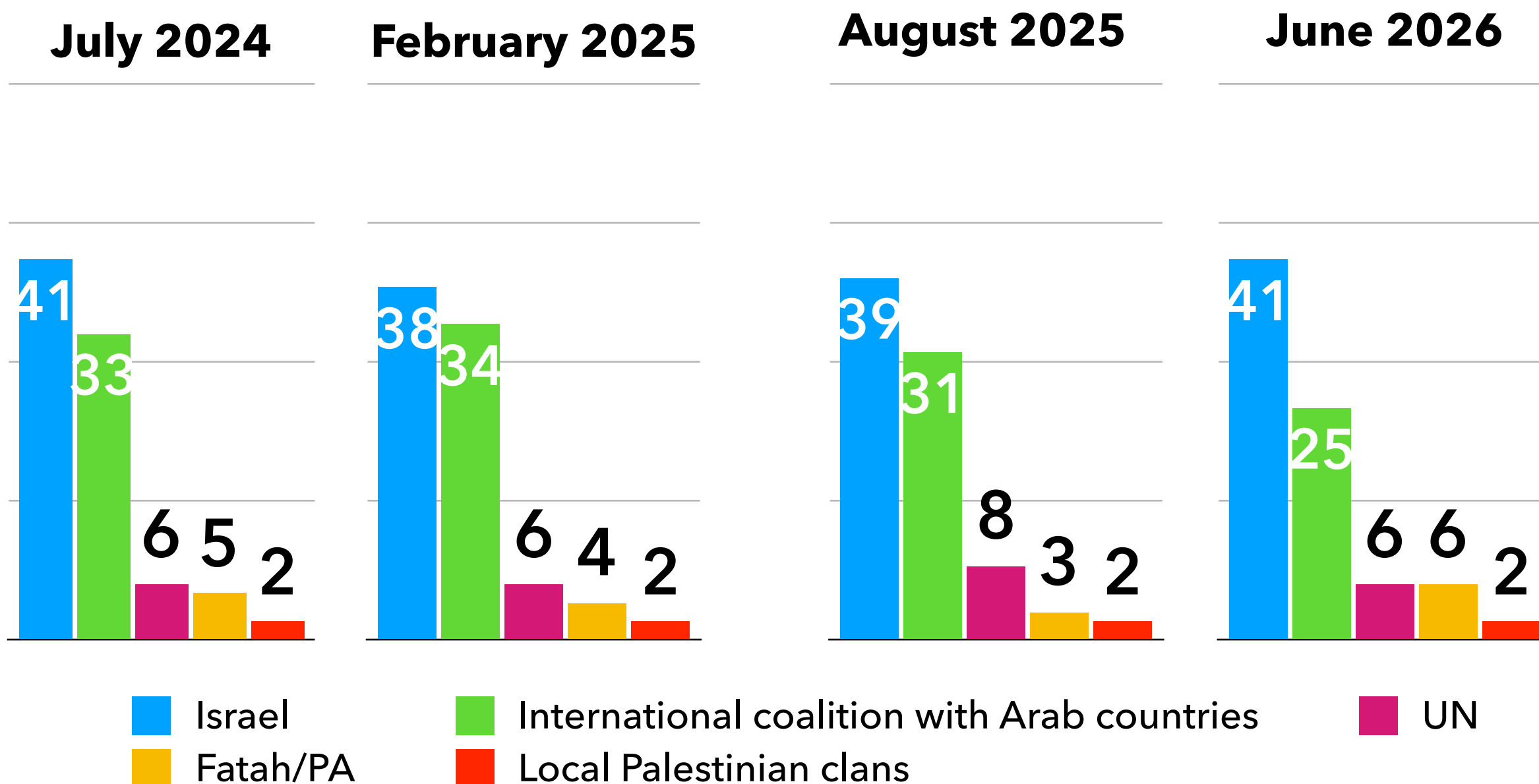

Israelis want to see Israel or an international coalition that includes Arab countries govern Gaza in coming years

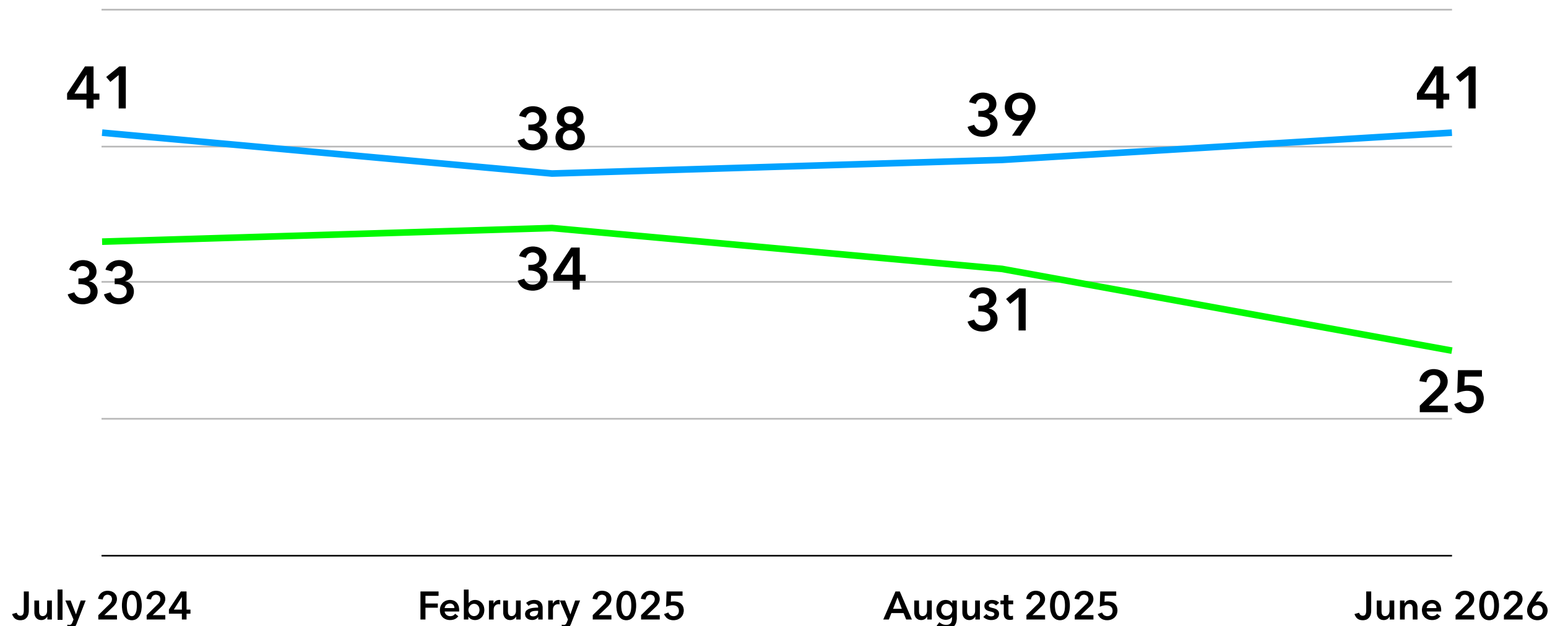
Thinking about the future of Gaza, who do you think should govern Gaza in the coming years?

Thinking about the future of Gaza, who do you think should govern Gaza in the coming years? (by age, answering Israel and coalition with Arab countries ONLY)

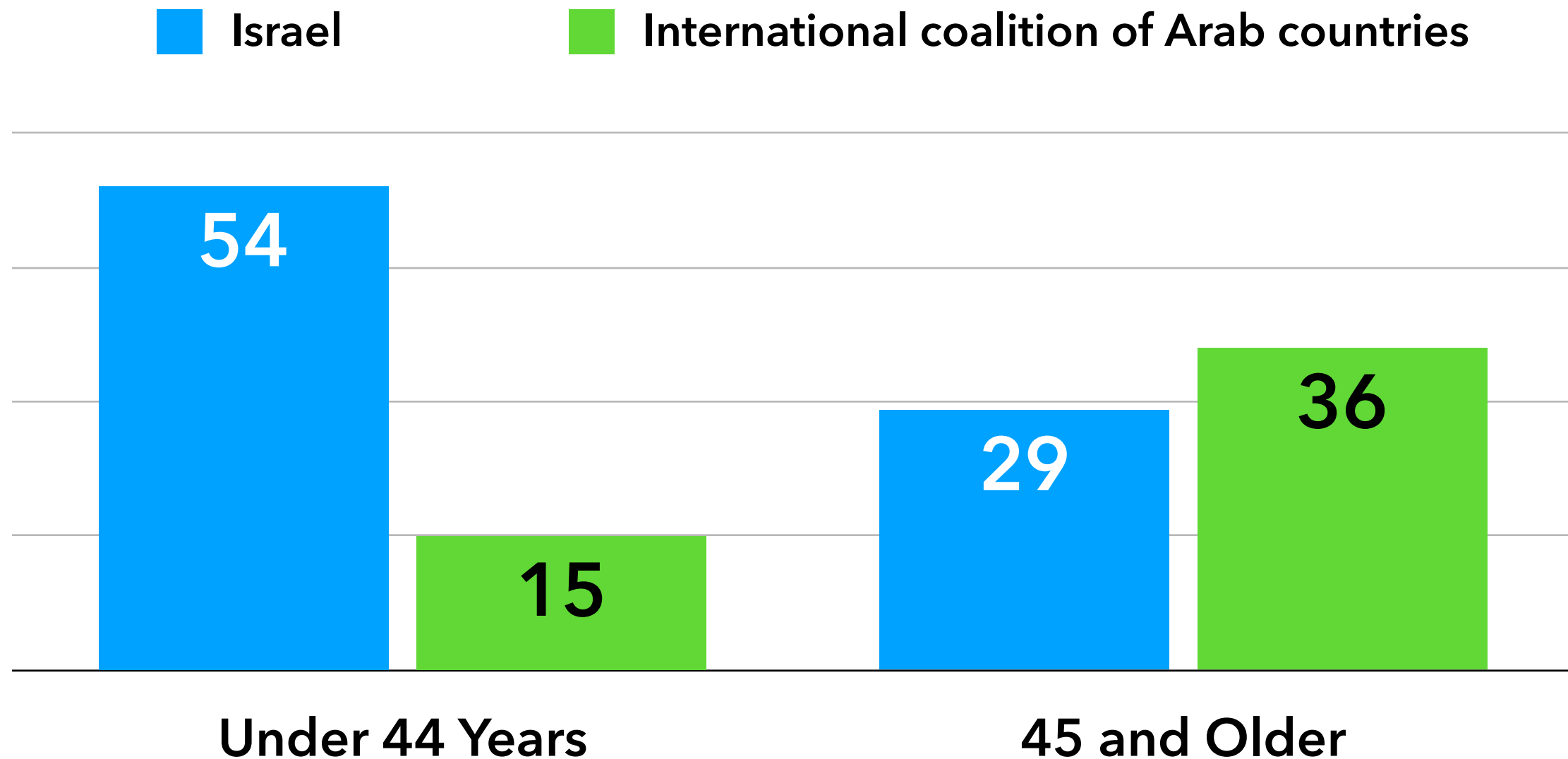

Thinking about the future of Gaza, who do you think should govern Gaza in the coming years? (by age, answering Israel and coalition with Arab countries ONLY)

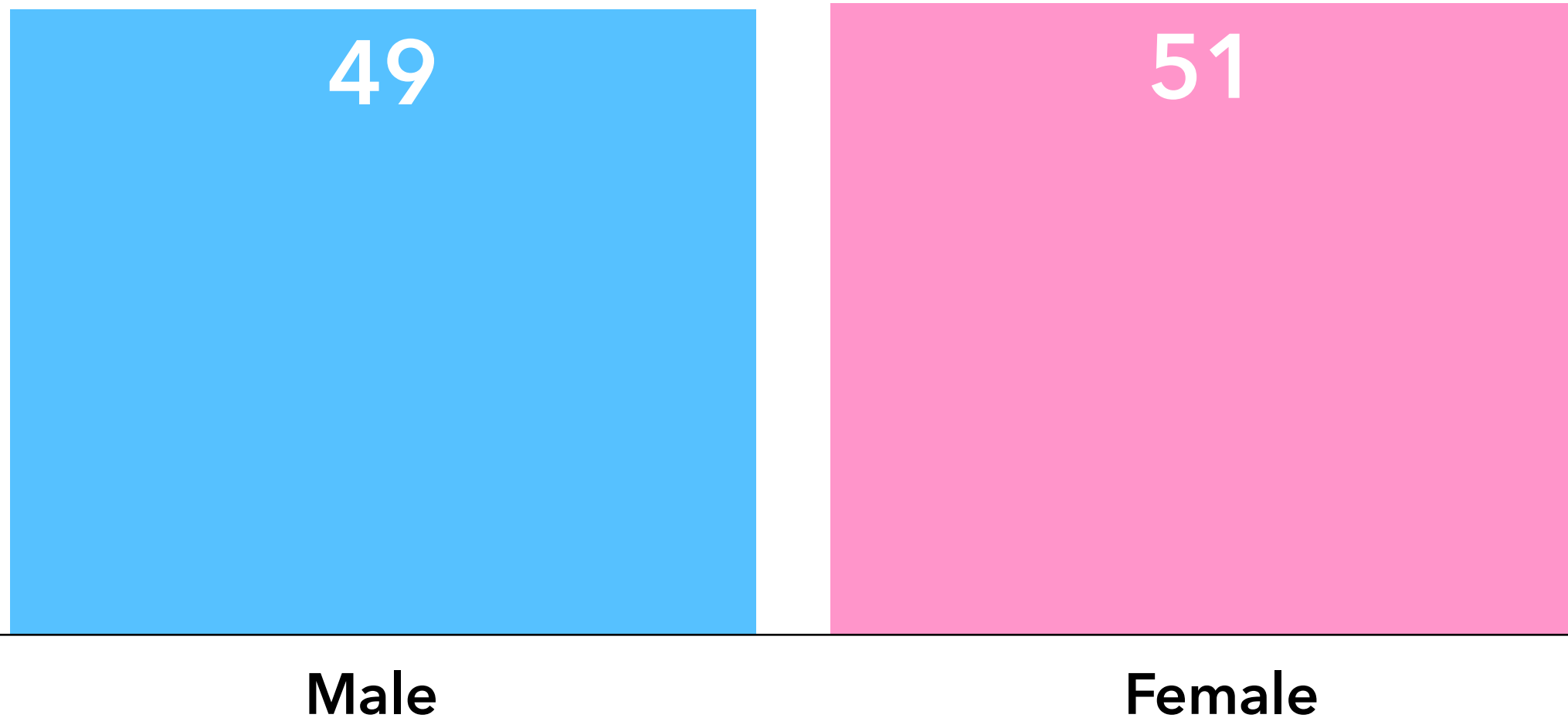

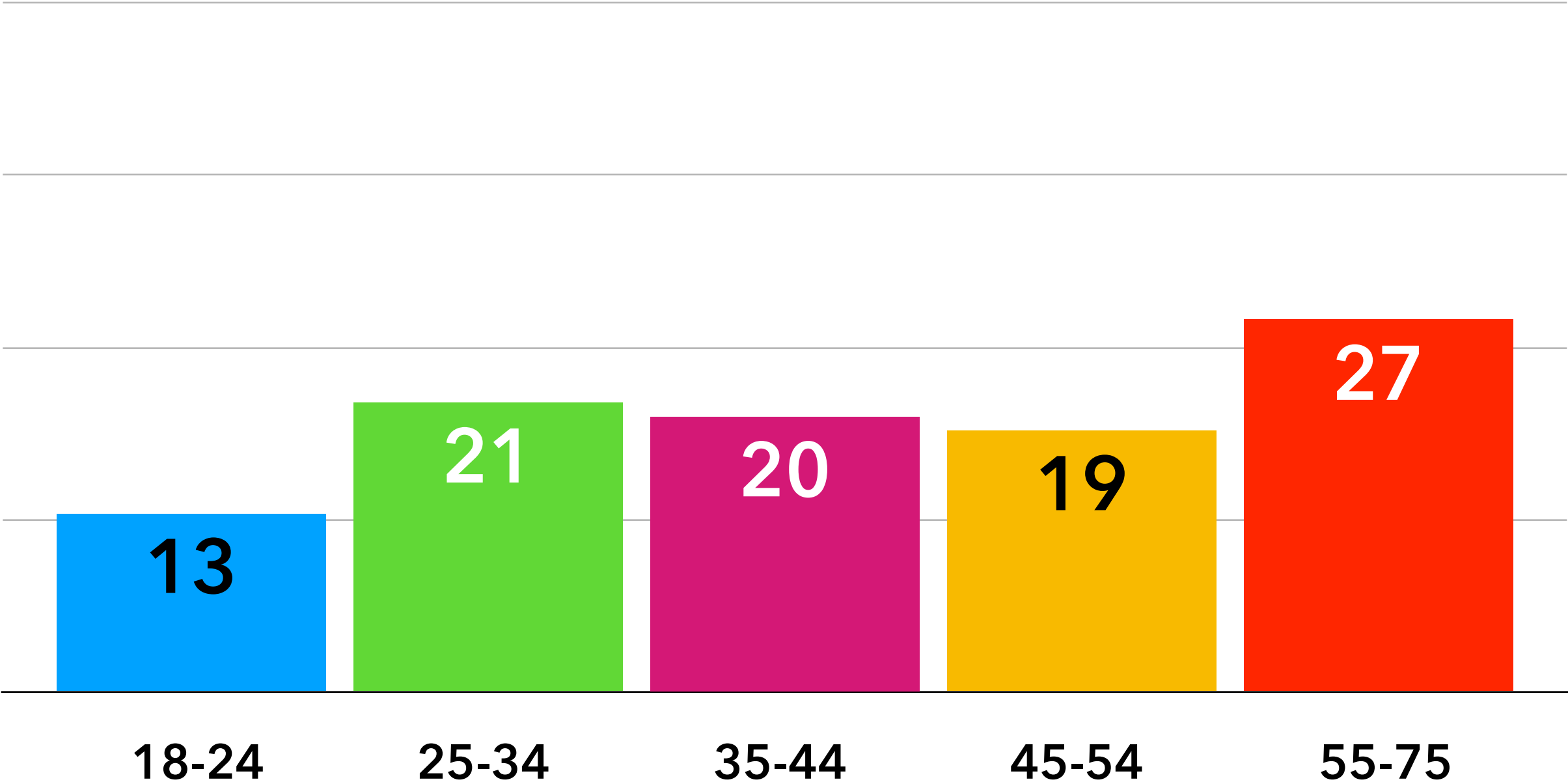
Gender of likely voters

Gender (recorded)



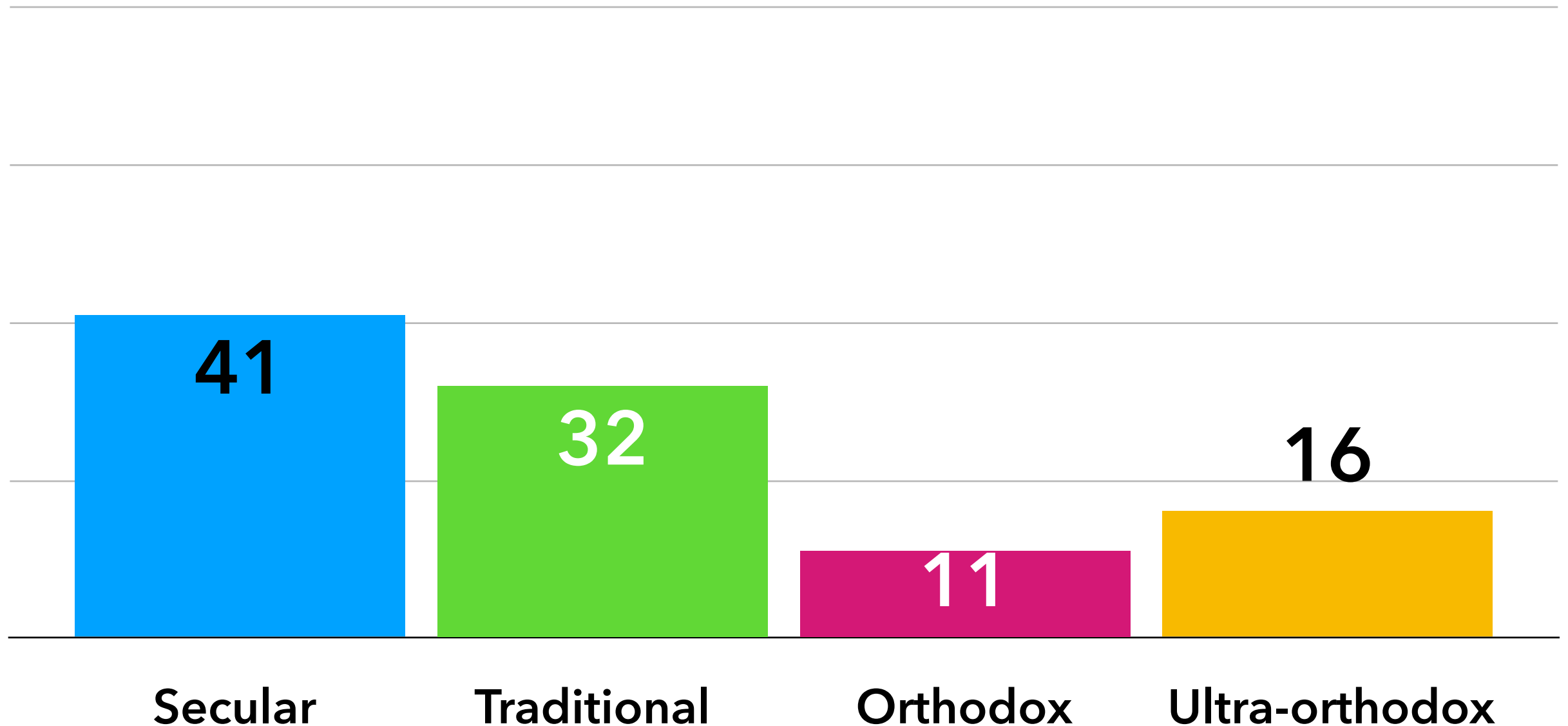
Age of likely voters

In what year were you born?



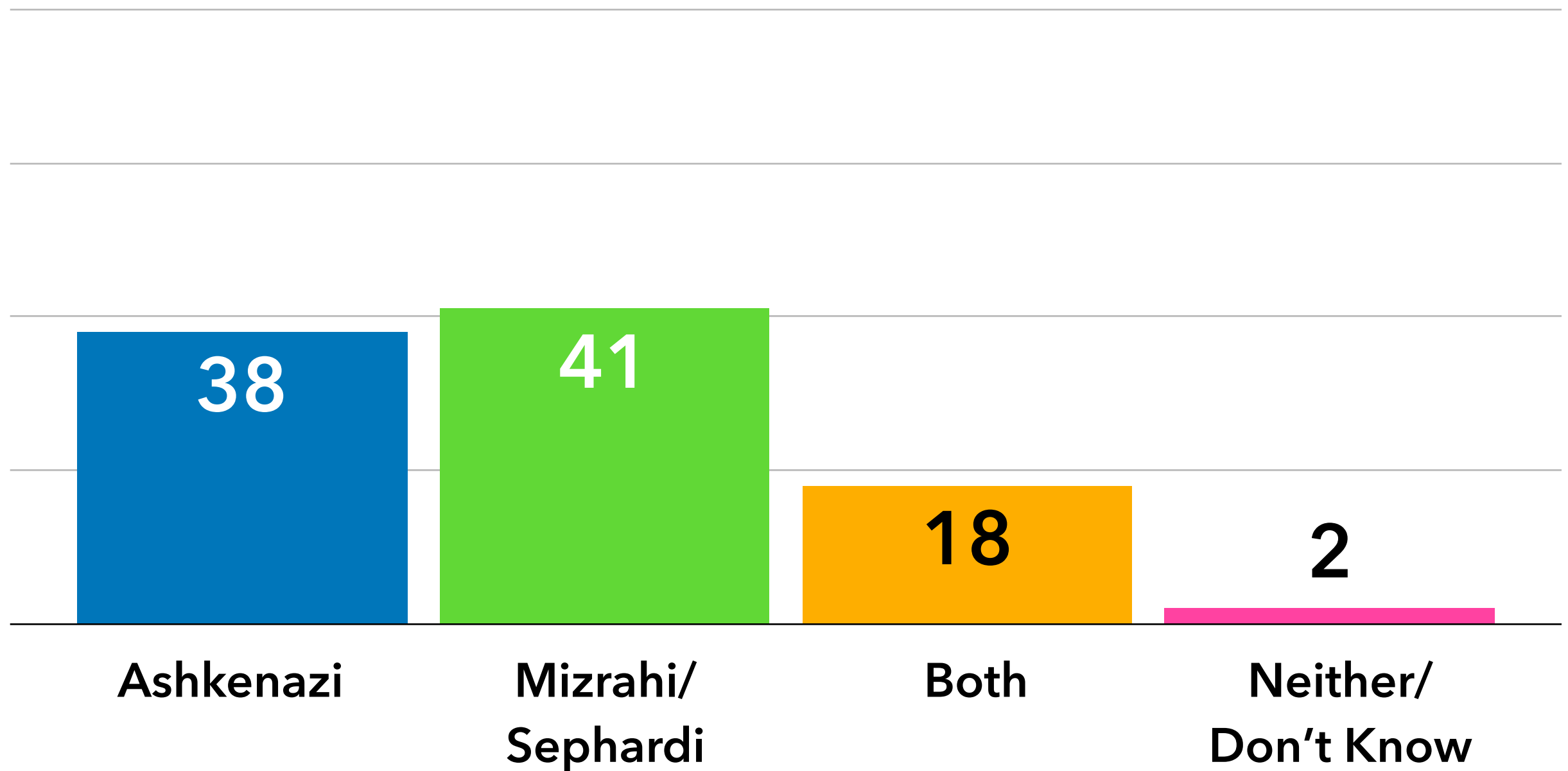
Religiosity of likely voters

Heritage of likely voters

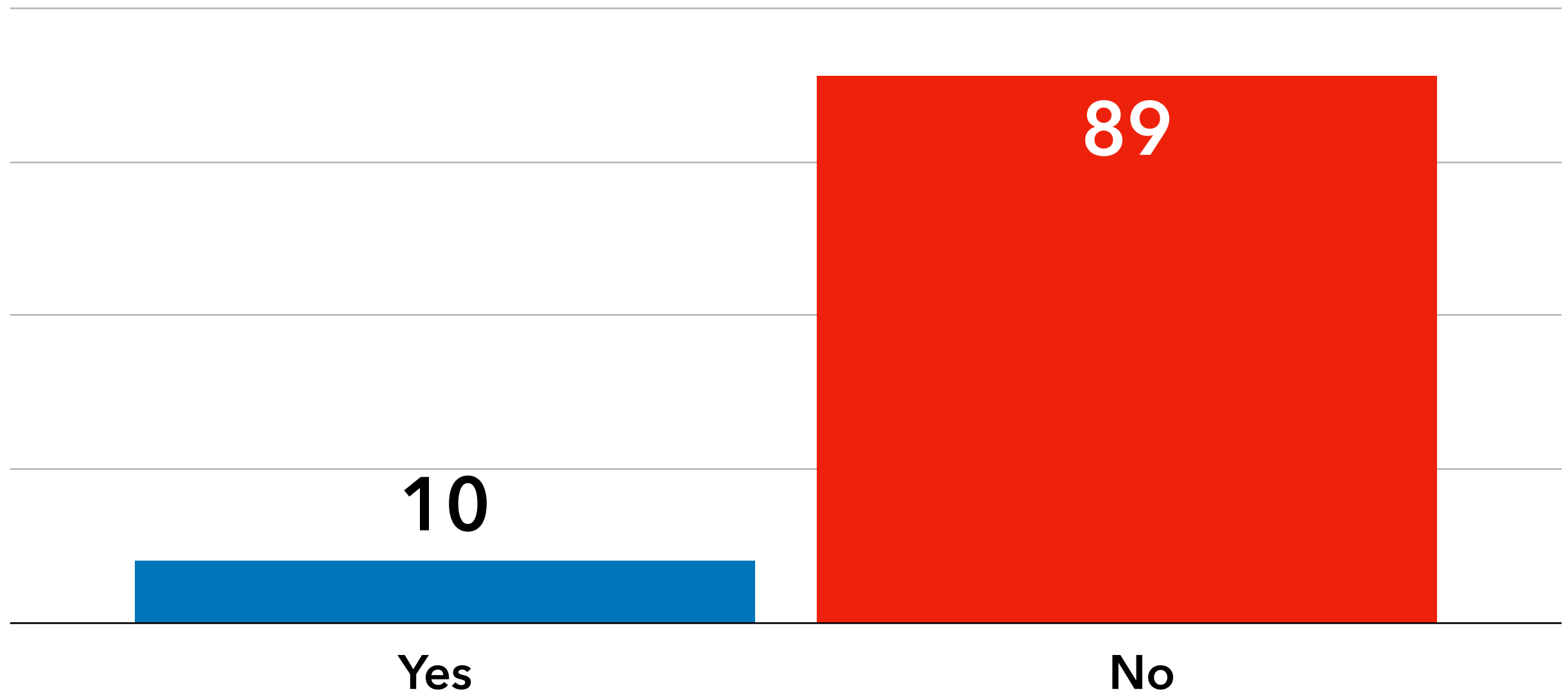
What best describes your heritage? (READ CHOICES)



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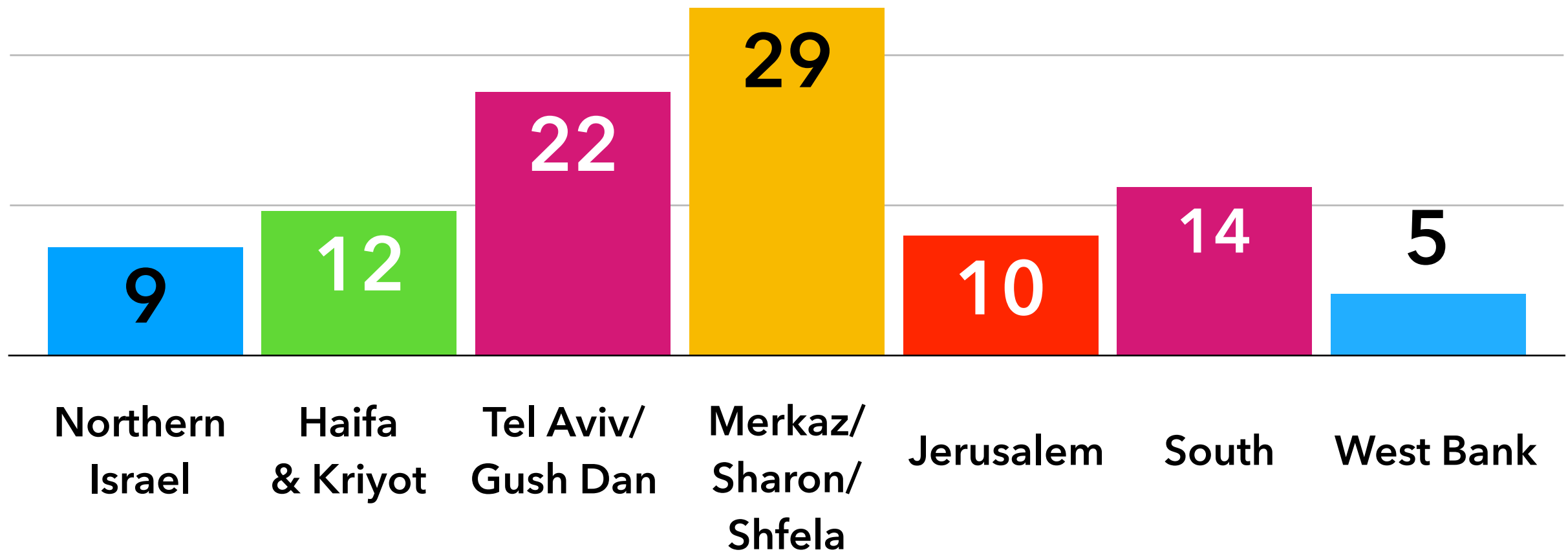
10%+ of likely voters immigrated from the FSU

Did you move from the Former Soviet Union after 1989?



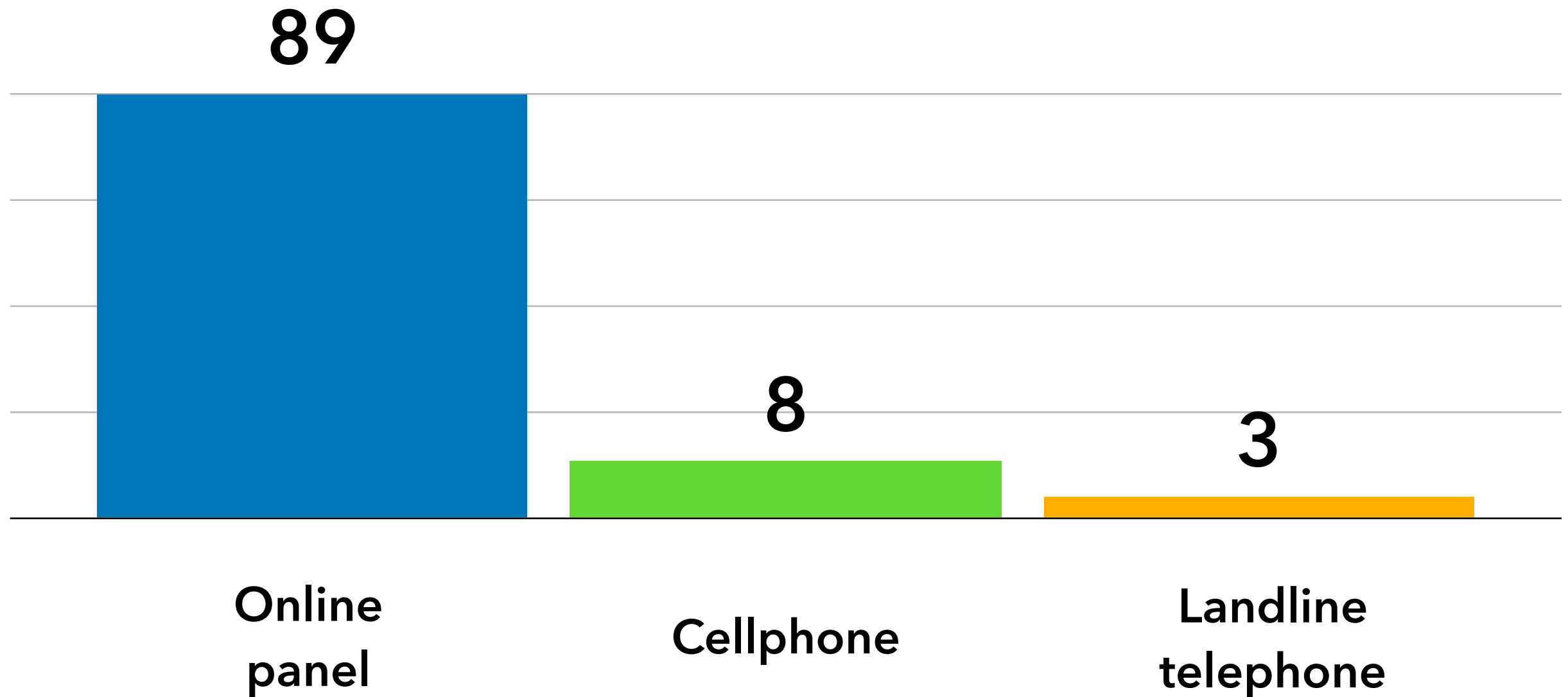
Geographic distribution of likely voters

Location of residence



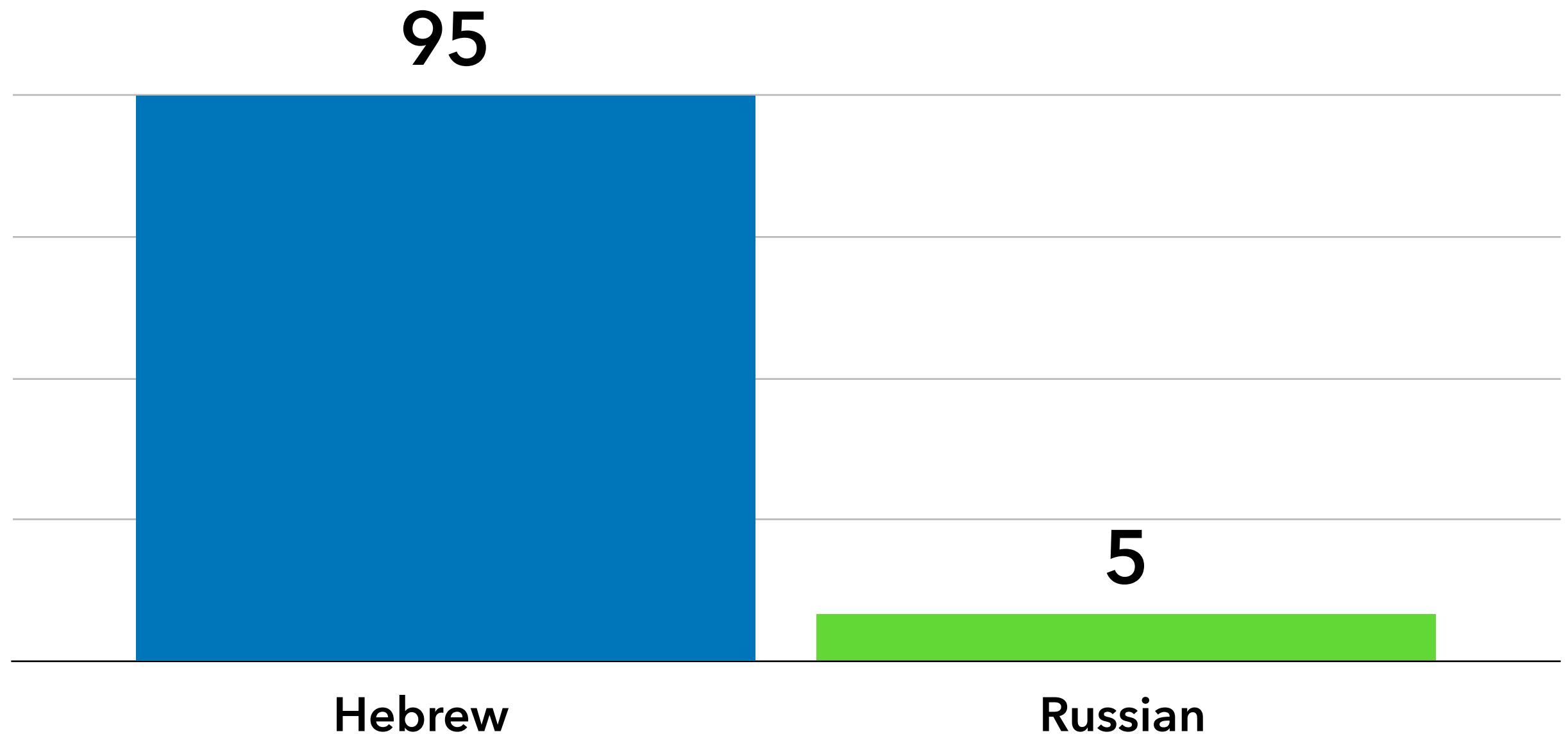
